

## **Our Commitment to HAPPY, HEALTHY Campers & Staff**

The WI district summer camps want to provide the **BEST** experience we can!

These guidelines may seem overwhelming; however, we **MUST** have camp!

Together, with the best covid safe operating procedures, we will mitigate as much risk as possible. This plan has been approved by Shawano County State Health Department and here is what you can expect for the 2021 camp season.

### **Registration at each camp....**

- Health history form for each camper & staffer to be filled out at check-in.
- Masks will be worn by staff during registration and encouraged by registrants.
- Hand sanitizer is required for all registrants and will be provided.

### **Masks for campers & staff...**

- Campers & staff are encouraged to bring their masks with them to be worn into buildings during registration & indoor fellowship.
- Masks will be worn by staff while serving food and beverages.

### **Sanitation of facilities....**

- We will have a designated sanitation team to clean each building & surfaces throughout each day.
- We will have hand sanitizer installed throughout our campus.
- We will have signage posted throughout our campus addressing proper hand washing & sanitizing.

### **Food service....**

- Sanitizer will be provided upon entering the serving line.
- Food & beverages will be served by staff only.
- Seating will be set for “**dorm communities**”
- Seating will be properly distanced at 3ft in cafeteria & tent.

### **Dorm communities (small groups) for junior & youth camps....**

- Each dorm will be considered a “**dorm community**”.
- All indoor activities, meals, and services will schedule according to these small groups.

### **Outdoor fun....**

- Due to the nature of our facilities, we can spread out for social distancing in small groups.
- Weather permitting, activities will be done outside as much as possible.
- We will have remote hand sanitizer stations available at such activities.

### **Closed campus to visitors....**

- We must close our campus during junior & youth camps to all people other than registered campers & staff.
- Family camp will remain as normal.

### **What if covid appears....**

- Dorm parents will monitor camper/children daily and report to health staff if needed.
- Staff/adults will self-monitor and report to health staff if needed.

If someone shows symptoms during junior and/or youth camps, they will be escorted to a safe isolation room while a rapid covid test is administered with prior approval. If permission for covid test was not given on registration forms, then camper/staff will be sent home.

If someone shows symptoms during family camp, they are responsible themselves to get covid tested and must show a negative test result from health facility to continue to stay on camp grounds.

- If someone tests positive for covid,
  - ✓ A tracking of the individuals they were in **DIRECT** contact with will be done.
  - ✓ Those individuals will be sent home to stop the spread.
